Equipment List

1. For full participation we strongly recommend **chest waders** (hip boots or something less will mean that you won't be able to do activities like frog and tadpole capture and float tubing).
2. Field-ready, weather-appropriate clothes that can get cow pond muck on them. April in Livermore can be surprisingly hot or unseasonably cold. The nighttime field session will most likely be very cold and windy so please bring winter layers.
3. If you already have a long-handled dip-net for capturing tadpoles, please bring. This is not mandatory, but the more dip-nets we have the more opportunity for everyone to capture tadpoles.
4. An adequate headlamp (or, less ideal, a good hand-held mag light) is **mandatory**. The great majority of LED lights will not suffice, and focusable incandescent lights are preferred. Please see "Headlamp Information.pdf" for more information.
5. We will bring a supply of water, but we encourage you to bring extra as there is no source of drinking water in the field. You will be in the field for about 4 hours in the afternoon field session, and another 4 hours in the nighttime field session.
6. The classroom meeting room has inconsistent air conditioning – please dress in layers.
7. Sun hat and/or sunscreen might be needed for the field.
8. Camera (optional).
9. Pen or pencil and a notebook.
10. We encourage everyone to bring their own water bottle and/or coffee mug to the classroom portion.
